– HOW TO CONTINUE READING
WITH YOUR CHILD

BEFORE YOU READ

You will help your child understand the text if you talk about the text before he or she reads it.

You can:

- Read the title of the text and the name/s of the author and illustrator
- Flick through and skim the text and illustrations
- Read the back cover of the book
- Look at the table of contents or list of chapters
- Talk about what the text may be about
- Talk about what your child already knows the text is about



*What do you think is going to happen in the next paragraph?
Why do you think that?*

AFTER READING

You will help your child understand the text if you talk about the text after he or she has read it.

You can:

- Talk about what the text is about or what your child has learned
- Talk about the content of the text on the basis of the illustrations, graphs etc.
- Talk about things your child recognises from everyday life or other texts
- Talk about things in the text that puzzle your child
- Talk about what your child finds most interesting in the text.

WHILE READING

- Talk about the illustrations, graphs etc.

- Talk about what the child believes the next paragraph will be about. Maybe the headline of the next paragraph can help your child guess and describe
